The learning is rich, exciting and diverse, but most importantly, it is accessible to all because we ensure all children have the skills they need to engage with their learning at every level. Our children benefit from increased collaboration and their learning is enhanced through experiencing the different settings our schools offer. As a partnership, we are able to offer specialist teachers for Physical Education, Music and MFL and the vibrant curriculum ensures the children have regular days out to support learning and visitors to our schools to extend curriculum opportunities. It is important to us that we build lifelong memories, so we offer all junior aged children a range of residential visits to places like Dartmoor, London and Segovia in Spain.

Being part of a dynamic Multi-Academy Trust like TEAM brings a whole host of additional benefits to our schools. We have Specialist Leaders of Education to support School Improvement work and a central team who can provide a wealth of knowledge and experience when tackling complex issues. Also, direct funding from the Department for Education gives us more independence and allows us to be more creative with our resources ensuring the children get the best provision possible.

Life, Love and learning to the Full is about seeking to achieve high academic standards for all our children but more importantly, it is about ensuring we provide a very supportive and positive environment for children to learn and to grow as global citizens. Purpose and Direction

To become a leading Multi-Academy trust in North Devon that is driven by its overarching commitment to serve the needs of all children

Why is this a priority?

The children of North Devon are currently growing up in a world that is rapidly changing. They have had to contend with a global pandemic, global warming and a wealth of information being communicated through the press and social media. At TEAM Multi-Academy Trust, we recognise that the children are going to need support like they never have done before. As a Trust we have a moral duty to ensure that the children receive the best care and education possible. Going forwards, the children must always be at the centre of our thinking.

Core Priorities

Curriculum & Assessment

To ensure there is a high quality curriculum on offer throughout the Trust that drives social mobility and improves the life chances of children especially for the most vulnerable.

Why is this a priority?

At TEAM Multi-Academy Trust, we seek to ensure that all our children receive a world class education. To achieve this, we will create an exciting globally thematic knowledge and skills based curriculum that excites the children and prepares them for life in modern day Britain.

- Is globally outward looking and provides the children with the chance to learn with children from around the world.
- provides the children with the opportunity to experience one Inspirational Big Event a term that provides the stimulus for the learning being undertaken.
- provides opportunities for children to lead their own learning to enable them to become confident, resourceful, creative and enquiring independent learners.

- When speaking with the children they speak with great enthusiasm about their learning, the Big Events and the breadth of subject on offer.
- Parent feedback highlights strengths within the Big Event curriculum. They would recommend their child's school to others.
- TEAM's curriculum intent, implementation and impact is clear and consistently embedded in each school.
- Each school has a global partner and is engaging with curriculum activities throughout each term.
- There is a consistent approach to assessment across the MAT.





Teaching & Learning

To secure high quality teaching and learning across all subjects and all key stages in all schools through the development of evidence led practice in the classroom

Why is this a priority?

At TEAM Multi-Academy Trust, we love teaching children and recognise that our teachers need to be supported and well looked after to ensure there is high quality learning on offer for our pupils. We are research, evidenced based and innovative in our approach to teaching and learning.

Investing In and Developing Others

Why is this a priority?

At TEAM Multi-Academy Trust, we believe that the development of others needs to be at the heart of everything. Professional learning is embedded in the TEAM framework for action because we recognise that all staff members need to see themselves as lifelong learners. We strive to ensure that our workforce at all levels learn to become more and more effective by engaging in a reflective process related to their actions. It is through this that we believe they can then adapt their practice to improve the outcomes for their children and staff.

Core Priorities

- Developing future school leaders and ensuring they receive high quality training.
- Develop an expectation that every school will be a giver and receiver of support. There are pockets of strong practice in weak schools and vice versa.
- Collaboration is most effective when teachers work together regularly rather than just discussing ideas. Our curriculum teams when fully established will support this.
- Making sure every member of staff has a personalised and bespoke development plan.
- Development of career paths through TEAM which will help attract, retain and support the improvement of high-quality teachers.

- TEAM staff taking up key leadership positions within the trust.
- TEAM schools are active in providing support for each other in a consistent and sustainable manner.
- Establish a peer-to-peer lesson study model/coaching framework.
- Senior Leadership have drawn up plans and evaluated their success.
- Low staff turnover due to enjoyment and challenge of working for TEAM.

EYFS Why is this a priority?

At TEAM Multi-Academy Trust we believe that it is moral duty to ensure all children receive the best possible start to their education. We strive to ensure that children are kept healthy, safe and have the knowledge and skills they need to start school. At the heart of our approach to Education in the Early Years is the principle that young children need to play to have fun, develop their social skills and understand the world around them. We endeavour to build on children's strengths, interests and experiences by providing a stimulating and relevant curriculum following the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Core Priorities

- Children will learn by playing and exploring, being active and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.
- Children are also encouraged to select activities on their own and with their friends.
- We create quiet carpet times for direct teaching, smaller group learning and a wide range of activities supported by staff.
- Develop children's language and vocabulary through
 - the development of high quality learning conversations with the teaching staff.
 - exposure to high quality stories, poems, rhymes and songs.
 - Teaching new vocabulary
- Ensure there is a high-quality curriculum centred on the seven areas of learning and development on offer throughout the Trust that drives social mobility and improves the life chances of children especially for the most vulnerable. Secure high-quality teaching and learning across all subjects and all key stages in all schools through the development of evidence led practice in the classroom
