RESILIENCE COMES WHEN CHILDREN KNOW IT IS SAFE TO MAKE MISTAKES.


Year 4 Multiplication Check - Parents information



What have we been learning in class this week?

Foundation Stage Class (Nursery & Class 1)

This week we have been making noisy, colourful firework pictures and creating firework models.



Class 2

This week in class 2 we began exploring our new class text 'Grandad's Island.' The children have made some careful predictions using clues from the story and came up with some wonderful ideas. We have been also working on developing our handwriting, so our letters are clearly formed and sit neatly on the line with pleasing results! In science, we have continued to explore different habitats, this week we looked closely at what plants and animals live in woodlands and compared this to the other habitats we have been investigating before the half term.




Class 3

It has been lovely to welcome class 3 back this week and already they've made a great start. We have begun our maths unit on addition and subtraction and I will be giving the children logins to begin practising their times tables using our school subscription of 'Times Tables Rockstars' on Friday. You will find these on the inside cover of their reading record book. I will also send home some more information about this in the children's homework books. Our topic in Art this term is sculpture and it would be amazing if children could bring in small boxes and kitchen roll tubes to create structures inspired by Antoni Gaudi. We will also be making 3D models of a Roman Villa so please raid your recycling! I will store them in the classroom ready for our construction sessions over the next few weeks. Many thanks for your continued support, the class 3 team.

Class 4

Class 4 have been applying their knowledge of factors and prime numbers to find prime factors this week - which they have mastered very quickly. We have also spent time looking at our new text in writing and making predictions about the story.


1ST JUNE 1945
