Make use of parental controls and filters which can be used on your home internet, devices, phone networks and online services such as Netflix and YouTube. Visit www.internetmatters.org/parental-controls to find out how you can set up controls on your home internet, phone network and online services such as Netflix. Parental controls will work best in combination with supervision and engagement to help your child understand how to stay safe online. As your child grows and develops, so do their online needs, therefore you may want to periodically review your parental controls to accommodate this. Always remember to choose a strong password and do not share it with your child.

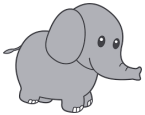


Learning Lions
